ULURU-KATA TJUṬA NATIONAL PARK – NORTHERN TERRITORY

DAY 2

- Discover the massive domes of Kata Tjuṯa (The Olgas) on a guided tour
- Enjoy a scenic helicopter tour, with views over Uluru, Kata Tjuṯa and even the great salt lake - Lake Amadeus
- For dinner, experience the do-it-yourself BBQ at the Outback Pioneer BBQ and Bar

DAY 3

- Take pleasure in some billy tea and beer-bread after you explore the red desert on your sunrise camel tour
- Enjoy lunch back at the Resort at one of the many restaurants and cafes and take a refreshing dip in one of the pools around the Resort
